Is The Red Book Right For My Student?

If your student has successfully completed *The Blue Book*, then he is ready for *The Red Book*. If your student used another reading program, this assessment will help you determine if *The Red Book* is right for your student.

All of the books in the *Learning Language Arts Through Literature* series cover all aspects of language arts; *The Red Book* reviews all the skills introduced in *The Blue Book* except reading. Therefore, if your student is ready to enter *The Red Book* reading instruction, he is ready for *The Red Book*.

Fold the student paper so that only **Row 1** is showing. Place this in front of your student so it can be read easily. Allow your student to use a ruler or paper to place under the word for ease of reading.

Hold your reading list so your student cannot see it. As your student reads the list, check off words that are pronounced correctly and circle words that are pronounced incorrectly. If your student misses three words in the list, stop him from reading.

If your student reads 8 - 10 of the words correctly in **Row 1**, refold the paper so that **Row 2** is showing and repeat above. You may want to complete this task over a period of days if that is better for your student.

Continue with **Row 3 – Row 5**.

Evaluation:

- 1. If your student correctly pronounces 8 10 words in each row, *The Red Book* is right for your student.
- 2. If your student missed 3 or more words in any row, your student is not ready for *The Red Book:*
 - a. If your student missed 3 or more words in **Row 1**, your student needs to begin with *The Blue Book*.
 - b. If your student missed 3 or more words in **Row 2**, teach or review blends and short vowel sounds found in *The Blue Book*, Part 3.
 - c. If your student missed 3 or more words in **Row 3**, teach or review long vowel sounds found in *The Blue Book*, Part 4.
 - d. If your student missed 3 or more words in **Row 4**, teach or review long vowel sounds found in *The Blue Book*, Part 4.
 - e. If your student missed 3 or more words in **Row 5**, teach or review sight words found in *The Blue Book*.
